

Research on Indigenous Data Governance Protocols

Position opening: Ethics Advisor

Background

Current data governance trends increasingly emphasize the need to open access to data, despite growing concerns over data privacy, control and surveillance. Indigenous peoples, with different epistemological traditions for the use and sharing of culturally sensitive information, reinforce the growing concern of people's ability to exert data sovereignty, especially since they hold specific collective rights under the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. Thus, while interest continues to grow on the documentation and use of Indigenous knowledge, current data governance trends do not align well with Indigenous data rights and governance rules. This is the case of most data on Indigenous peoples especially within EU open-data research.

Using the [Local Indicators of Climate Change Impacts](#) research project as a case study, the [Research on Indigenous Data Governance Protocols \(RIDAGOP\)](#) – a 18-month European Research Council (ERC) Proof-of-Concept research project – aims to contribute to the field of Indigenous Data Sovereignty (IDS) by developing a toolkit to guide research institutions in better understanding how to handle sensitive Indigenous knowledge and cultural information in open research contexts in order to better adhere to IDS principles (e.g. CARE Principles). The project aims to contribute to the work of leading organizations in this field (e.g., Global Indigenous Data Alliance). The potential of this research is to help reframe how datasets concerning Indigenous peoples are interpreted and managed in EU open research projects and consequently how Indigenous peoples' knowledge is represented.

Roles & Responsibilities

1. **Assess how RIDAGOP is meeting or making progress on ERC ethical requirements:** The EA will be responsible for reviewing RIDAGOP documentation and activities, and subsequently developing (max) *two* reports of (max) *three* pages each, identifying how the project is or is not meeting ERC ethical requirements, and provide advice in case of the latter.
2. **Advise on Indigenous data governance and sovereignty practices beyond, yet compatible with, ERC ethical requirements:** As a project dedicated to upholding Indigenous data sovereignty principles across European research institutions, the EA will participate in *four* 2-hour meetings with the core team in the span of 12 months, to better understand and provide feedback on the research. The EA is also expected to be available for ad-hoc questions via e-mail, for no more than *two* hours per month.

- A university degree in a research-related field
- Demonstrated experience in policy and regulatory frameworks for research governance, research integrity and the ethics arena within the EU (including GDPR, ERC, FAIR principles).
- Demonstrated experience working with Indigenous peoples' ethical concerns, Indigenous data sovereignty principles (e.g. CARE principles), and/or Indigenous data governance practices.

Time commitments & deliverables:

- Two reports of (max) three pages each (1 work day per report) **16 hrs.**
- Participation and feedback in four meetings (2 hours per meeting) **8 hrs.**
- Availability for ad-hoc feedback & discussion (2 hours per month) **24 hrs.**
